

PSYCHIATRY POSITION

We are a private Mental Health Rehabilitation Clinic. Our highly qualified staff includes: Psychiatrists, Licensed Clinical Professionals, and non-licensed Master's and Bachelor level counselors.

We offer comprehensive services to children ages 3 and up, adolescents, adults and families who are experiencing any of the following challenges:

- ADHD and other Cognitive/Learning Disorders
- Depressive Disorder and Bipolar Disorder
- Schizophrenia and other Psychotic Disorders
- Conduct Disorders (often including fighting, bullying, legal problems)
- Generalized Anxiety Disorder
- PTSD and Acute Stress Disorder
- Panic Disorders
- Adjunct support can also be provided for: Autism and Substance Abuse Disorders

The Mental Health Rehabilitation (MHR) Program is administered by the Department of Health and Hospitals through a partnership of the Louisiana Medicaid Program, the fiscal intermediary, the Office of Mental Health, and the network of certified and enrolled providers.

MHR services are for adults with serious mental illness and children with emotional/behavioral disorders. The services are outpatient and designed to reduce the disability resulting from mental illness and assist in the recovery and resiliency of the recipient. These services are home and community-based and are provided on an as needed basis to assist recipients in coping with the symptoms of their illness.

The intent of MHR services is to minimize the disabling effects on the individual's capacity for independent living and to prevent or limit the periods of inpatient treatment. Providers offer prior-authorized services to adults with mental illness and youth with an emotional/behavioral disorder who meet medical necessity criteria for services.

Position Summary:

The psychiatrist provides on-site clinical consultation, assessments, and medication management at least 3 times per month for recipients served by the agency.

Psychiatrist's Duties include:

- Face-to-face direct service to the recipient.
- Coordination with the primary care physician.
- Provides direction, as needed, in crisis and potential need for hospitalization.
- Organizes data concerning recipient's family, medical history, and onset of symptoms obtained from recipient, relatives, and other resources.
- Examines recipient to determine general physical condition.
- Orders laboratory and other special diagnostic tests and evaluates data obtained.
- Determines nature and extent of mental disorder and formulates treatment program.
- Treats or directs treatment of recipient, utilizing a variety of psychotherapeutic methods and medications.

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Education/Experience:

- Board-certified or board-eligible, licensed medical doctor. Must be authorized to practice psychiatry in Louisiana and enrolled to participate in the Louisiana Medicaid Program. The physician must hold an unrestricted license to practice medicine in Louisiana and unrestricted Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) and state and federal controlled substances licenses. Must be a doctor of medicine with American Psychiatric Association approved training in psychiatry:
 - Board certified or eligible in psychiatry;
 - Medical Physician-MD doctor of medicine, DO doctor of osteopathy;
 - MD certified in addiction medicine;
 - Doctoral-level psychologist-Ph.D. Psy.D;
 - **If licenses are held in more than one state or jurisdiction, all licenses held by the physician must be documented in the personnel record and also be unrestricted.**
- Bilingual (English / Spanish) preferred.
